ANALYSIS OF PROBLEMS IN THE TRANSLATION OF ROBINSON CRUSOE BY DANIEL DEFO FROM ENGLISH TO UZBEKI

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ANNOTATION

This article was written by Daniel Defoe - the translation of the anthroponyms in "Robinson Crusoe" from English to Uzbek and the factors influencing their meaning from the linguistic point of view were analyzed taking into account the factors influencing the reader's understanding. Since the anthroponyms chosen as objects are fabrics, before the names of the anthroponyms, their function in the work was thought out, and then it was put into linguistic patterns. Because of this, templates are offered for etymological, lexicological, semantic and phonetic analysis before the translator of the article translates them into Uzbek.

Anthroponymics are famous names of people, toponymics are famous names of geographical objects, onymics are names of various religious and mythical persons and creatures, zoonymics are famous names given to animals, cosmonymics are naming regions of space, galaxies and constellations. According to the linguistic features of the famous names, they are divided into literary and dialectal, usual [practical] and poetic, modern and historical and practical types. The emergence of famous names in theoretical language and speech, literary dialectal fields, the basis of nomination [naming], various changes in this process of development in speech its use is spread in the languages of a certain region.

The pamphlet "Experiments on projects" (1697) proposed a number of political and economic reforms. In many of his works, he advocated entrepreneurship, common sense, freedom of belief and speech, and promoted the ideas of democracy ("Recommendation of a humble man", 1698, etc.). D. exposes the proud nobles ("Noble Englishman", 1701). In 1702, he was imprisoned for publishing a pamphlet entitled "The Easiest Way to Revenge Dissenters" under the pseudonym. D.'s novel "The Life, Wonderful and Strange Adventures of Robinson Crusoe" (1719) brought him worldwide fame. Adventure novels "Captain Singleton" (1720), "History of Colonel Jacques", "Moll Flanders" (1722), "Roxana" (1724) are also full of interesting details. Many works based on the novel "Robinson Crusoe" have been created in world literature. This novel has been published several times in Uzbek, translated by Yoldosh Shamsharoy.

The adventures of Alexander Selkchi actually formed the story of "Robinson Crusoe". Defoe traveled a lot. He visited Spain, France, Holland and all of England. These trips not only enriched his geographical knowledge, but also helped him to enter the psychology of the life psychology of the people. The writer created a new genre of the novel in English literature. This genre was a unique alloy of adventure novel with social and philosophical.

THE RESULT

Analyzing this sentence, the differences of morphological transformations between the two languages, that is, between the original and the translated language, for example; In English, that is, in the original language - 4 pronouns, 2 verbs, 3 prepositions, 4 articles, 9 nouns, 2 numbers, 1 adjective, 1 adverb.

In Uzbek, i.e. in translated language, there are 4 nouns, 10 nouns, 2 numbers, 6 verbs, 2 auxiliary words, connectives and helpers.

Comment on the morphological transformations found in the analysis of the sentence; that is, in this sentence, 2 verbs were involved in the original language, and 6 verbs were involved in the translated language. There were 9 pronouns in the original language, and 10 nouns in the translated language.

Another important aspect is that the preposition and articles present in the original language, i.e. English, are used instead of the preposition in the translated language, i.e. Uzbek, but there is no preposition in Uzbek grammar.
