Cons of homeschooling

1. Parents are required to dedicate a substantial commitment of time and effort . This is especially critical if they have more than one child.

2. Less interaction with outside world. Students are mostly overwhelmed with completing their tasks by spending most of the time at home.

3. Education may not be well-organized if parents avoid subjects such as higher science, math and foreign languages.

4. Homeschool can also be expensive when considering: curriculum costs, online homeschool programs, homeschool supplies, extracurricular activities.

Pros of private school

1. Smaller class sizes. Your child is given more attention by trained professionals due to the number of students in each class.

2. High academic focus. Private schools encourage students to make them work hard academically to achieve greater success .

3. Advanced technology. All private schools have access to the network, and provided with up-to-date technological tools ranging from a computer, a laptop to a projector.

4. Strict control. In this type of schools the academic performance, achievements healthy diet and safety of your child all are taken into consideration by strict rules.

Pros of homeschool
